


**Choosing courses for Grade 12**

# UNIVERSITY REQUIREMENTS

- Students wishing to apply to an Ontario university **MUST** have a minimum of **6** Grade **12** U (University) or **M** (University/College) level courses.
- One of these MUST be ENG4U.
- •Other prerequisites are program specific.
  - For example: Chemical Engineering at Toronto Metropolitan University requires ENG4U, MHF4U, MCV4U, SPH4U, SCH4U.





- It is highly recommended that all students aim to graduate with 31 credits.


