WHAT IS SHSM SPORT?

The **Specialist High Skills Major (SHSM) Sport** is a Ministry of Education, approved program designed for students interested in sport, fitness, leadership, and health.

The program combines classroom learning with hands-on experiences and prepares students for all postsecondary pathways, including:

- **Apprenticeship**
- **College**
- **University**
- **The workplace**



WHAT IS PAI 301?

PAI 301 Grade 11 focuses on developing a healthy lifestyle through participation in a variety of physical activities. Students build leadership, communication, and teamwork skills while gaining experience in sport-related roles. Students are provided the opportunity to engage in trips, experience guest presenters, and receive sport-industry certifications.

This course is like a foundation credit for the **SHSM Sport program** and allows students to begin earning mandatory certifications toward the **SHSM Sport seal**.





This course enables students to broaden their understanding of mathematics as a problem solving tool in the real world. Students will extend their understanding of quadratic relations; investigate situations involving exponential growth; solve problems involving compound interest; solve financial problems connected with vehicle ownership; develop their ability to reason by collecting, analysing, and evaluating data involving one variable; connect probability and statistics; and solve problems in geometry and trigonometry. Students will consolidate their mathematical skills as they solve problems and communicate their thinking.




